TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY AFFAIRS COMPREHENSIVE ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CEAP)

The purpose of CEAP is to assist low-income households to meet their immediate home energy needs. CEAP subrecipient organizations include Community Action Agencies, private nonprofit organizations, and units of local government. Funds are used to provide utility payment assistance, repair and in some cases replacement of existing heating and cooling units, and crisis-related purchase of portable heating and cooling units.

CEAP is funded through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) from the U.S Department of Health and Human Services (USHHS). LIHEAP funds are also utilized by the Department to support the Weatherization Assistance Program.

- USHHS allocates, by formula, to the States.
- In Texas, the Governor has designated TDHCA to administer LIHEAP. Each year, Texas distributes approximately \$150 million in CEAP funding to its subrecipients.
- TDHCA distributes funds, utilizing a formula which considers the following factors: County Non-Elderly Poverty Household Factor (40%), County Elderly Poverty Household Factor (40%), County Inverse Household Population Density Factor (5%), County Median Income Variance Factor (5%), and County Weather Factor (10%). Demographic factors are based on the most recent decennial U.S. Census available.
- There are 35 CEAP subrecipients, serving all 254 counties in Texas. See attached map/list of Providers.
- In order to be eligible for services, the household income must be at or below 150% of the federal poverty guidelines and one member must be a U.S. citizen.
- CEAP funds are utilized to provide utility assistance (gas and electric service), to purchase propane for heating, to repair and replace heating and cooling units. Funds can also be used to assist households whose energy has been interrupted by a disaster. A percentage of the grant also supports the Department's Weatherization Assistance Program which weatherizes homes to make them more energy efficient.
- In SFY 2023 (9/1/2022-8/31/2023), CEAP subrecipient organizations in Texas assisted 138,453 households, approximately 449,972 persons.
