12	residence, including a person who is:
13	(A) living in an emergency shelter;
14	(B) abandoned in a hospital; or
15	(C) awaiting foster care placement;
16	(2) has a primary nighttime residence that is a public
17	or private place not designed or ordinarily used as a regular
18	sleeping accommodation for humans; or
19	(3) is living in a car, park, other public space,
20	abandoned building, substandard housing, bus or train station, or
21	similar setting.

- 3 (1) collect data on the number of homeless youth in

- 5 (2) examine the needs of homeless youth and the degree

- 7 (3) identify any sources of funding that might be
- 8 available to provide services to homeless youth; and
- 9 (4) develop a strategic plan establishing steps to be
- 10 taken and timelines for reducing youth homelessness in this state.
- 11 (c) The department shall submit a report on the study to the
- 12 legislature not later than December 1, 2016. The report must
- 13 include a summary of the information resulting from the study and

- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
