IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING HUD LABEL AND TEXAS SEAL


All HUD Code Homes manufactured after June 15, 1976, are assigned a HUD Label (plate) and affixed to the outside of the home (see image below). If the metal plate is currently affixed to the manufactured home, the identification number shown on the plate should be reflected on your application on Page 1, block 2a. You will mark the appropriate box on Page 1, Block 2b, YES. If a home is considered a "double-wide", each side of the home will have a metal plate.



If the home has a Texas Seal affixed to the outside of the home (see below image), then this is the information you will state on the application, Page 1, Block 2a.



If neither the original HUD Tag nor Texas Seal is affixed to your home, you must purchase a Texas Seal at \$35.00, per section. Mark Page 1, Block 2b, NO and check the appropriate section(s) that requires a Seal. Singlewides – Section One; Double-Wide – either Section One or Two or Both (if missing). Please include a completed Addendum to Application of Statement of Ownership (Form 1071) located in our website.



Please note that Serial numbers are not reassigned. If you are having difficulty locating the Serial numbers, please attempt to locate the DATA PLATE (see below image). This information can be located inside of the home in either the master bedroom closet, under the kitchen sink, water heater closet or other bedroom closets. The Data Plate contains the following information: Manufacturer, HUD Label / Serial numbers, wind zone and date of manufacture. You may use the Data Plate to assist in completing the application. If located, you may provide a LEGIBLE photocopy with your application in order to assist with the processing of the application.
