The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (Department) received documentation on September 9, 2025 addressing the noncompliance identified during the review of the Audit Report submitted by Stephanie Naquin on June 30, 2025. Corrective action was due on September 14, 2025.

The documentation submitted was sufficient to correct the noncompliance related to **Failure to comply with the Public Facility Corporation Regulatory Agreement** regarding required lease language for all income restricted units, **Household above the income limit** affecting units A708, A814, B1901, B206, B311, A401, A210, B603, B1010-R, B1309-R, A107, B112, A115, B116, B308, A514, A805, A809, B1303, B1503, B2201, B2214, A312-R, B1906-R and B415-R B309.
